## Geralyn Miller Joins EBRI Board for ASPPA

ARLINGTON, Va. — Professor Geralyn M. Miller, Ph.D., of Indiana University - Purdue University in Ft. Wayne, Ind., was named a member of the board of trustees of the nonpartisan Employee Benefit Research Institute (EBRI) in Washington, D.C. She represents the American Society of Pension Professionals & Actuaries (ASPPA) on the EBRI board.

Miller is the executive director of the Institute for Pension Plan Management. She holds a Master of Arts in governmental relations from De Paul University, and a doctorate in public policy analysis from the University of Illinois Chicago. She spent the early part of her career with the Illinois Department of Insurance where she started as a market conduct examiner and became a legislative liaison before entering the academic field.
